Garages in Hamilton Hill are too small – creating additional street parking where residents are unable to park their vehicles in available garage space	
Public transport route to be made available for Hamilton Hill Residents	
Lack of footpaths and on road parking is an ongoing issue for all Woodforde residents and needs to be addressed	
Road cut ins are required, similar to Cross Road pavers – at least on side of the roads for minimum access and safety	
Speed restriction should be considered	
Clarify responsibility for verges, maintaining and replacing plants – Council or residents	
When changes are made to footpaths and on-road parking ensure that there is uniformity in verge plants
